### Applying for this course

#### **Course Duration**

This course is of 48 hours duration and consists of four Modules

- Module 1 is of 12 hours duration (including 1-hour assessment)
- Module 2 is of 12 hours duration (including 1-hour assessment)
- Module 3 is of 12 hours duration (including 1-hour assessment)
- Module 4 is of 12 hours duration (including 1-hour assessment)

### General pedagogical guidelines and procedures for this course:

The delivery of this course will be mainly held through a series of practical, hands-on exercises. The trainer will be holding lessons with the learners in a computer lab set-up, which will consist of various discussions and client-specific case studies.

## General assessment policy and procedures for this course:

The learner will be assessed through a written test. The learner will also undergo an ongoing oral assessment of learning (including communication skills) and practical exercises that will take place throughout the entire programme. This assessment method gives tutors the opportunity to review and consolidate the learning being covered.

#### **Module 1 Assessment:** The assessment paper will have only 1 section:

• Section A – Multiple choice questions. These all need to be answered.

### Module 2 Learning Outcomes – Website Planning and Elements of Web Design

- ✓ Manage the button behaviour such as the default button and know its purpose and role
- ✓ Create form validation such as required fields
- Deal with status messages such as errors, warnings, and confirmations

Section A – Multiple choice questions, which all need to be answered.

#### Module 3 Assessment: The assessment paper will be divided into 1 section:

Section A – A mixture of multiple choice questions and open-ended short answer questions. These
all need to be answered.

The duration of this assessment is of 1 hour and the pass mark is that of 45%.

## Module 4 Learning Outcomes - Risk and Web Security

- ✓ Ensure to keep all software up to date
- ✓ Deal with SQL injection attacks
- ✓ Deal with error messages
- Carry out tasks related to server-side validation/form validation
- Carry out tasks related to passwords connected to the server and to the website administration area
- ✓ Deal with risks that portray file uploads
- Carry out tasks related to secure sockets layer (SSL) protocol
- Carry out tasks related to website security tools testing.

#### **Module 4 Assessment:**

The learner will need to undertake a project assignment (developing a website) which will take into account the knowledge gained from all the four modules of this course.

The pass mark is that of 45%. This assignment will be done at home and will be handed in to the Trainer during the final module.
